

Journal of Clinical Neurophysiology Call for Editor-In-Chief Applications

The *Journal of Clinical Neurophysiology (JCN)*, a leading journal in Clinical Neurophysiology and the official journal of the American Clinical Neurophysiology Society (ACNS), is seeking applications for the position of Editor-in-Chief. The start date for the position is February 1, 2022, but the incoming Editor will be expected to begin work January 1, 2022 to ensure a smooth transition from the current Editor.

The ideal candidate will possess the following attributes:

- 1) A background in academic medicine, including participation on journal editorial boards;
- 2) Extensive experience in basic, clinical, or translational research in Clinical Neurophysiology;
- 3) The ability to make a commitment, including adequate time and energy, to continue to increase the reputation and importance of *JCN* in the Clinical Neurophysiology community and the medical community at-large;
- 4) Current member of ACNS (<u>www.acns.org</u>).

Editor-in-Chief Position Description

Aims:

The American Clinical Neurophysiology Society and the *Journal of Clinical Neurophysiology (JCN)* are dedicated to serving patients and society by empowering members to advance the science, practice and profession of clinical neurophysiology.

Responsibilities:

- Serve as Editor-in-Chief for a term of four (4) years, with a second term possible;
- Select members to serve as Deputy Editor, Associate Editors, and members of the Editorial Board, as needed;
- Increase the number of high-quality articles published by soliciting submissions and increasing the JCN's visibility and impact;
- Organize the regular publication of review articles and associated CME questions, supplements, and advertisements, as appropriate;
- Maintain a peer-review process that is both time-sensitive and equitable;
- Review final versions of peer-reviewed manuscripts prior to submission for publication;
- Route appropriate manuscripts to the publisher for production;
- Plan the content of individual JCN issues;
- Hold an annual Editorial Board meeting in conjunction with the Publisher and the JCN Editorial Board;
- Ensure that the editorial and budgetary goals for JCN are met;
- Provide period reports to and collaborate with the ACNS Council, as needed;
- Work effectively with the Publisher's staff supporting JCN;
- Work effectively with the Editorial Office and Managing Editor supporting JCN;
- Coordinate website updates with the ACNS Executive Office staff and Communications Committee;
- Ensure JCN remains relevant to ACNS members.

Compensation:

A stipend in the amount of \$30,000 USD per year will be provided to the Editor-in-Chief. Additionally, funds are provided for editorial office support.

Conflicts of Interest

Candidates for Editor-in Chief should consider and acknowledge potential conflicts of interest with this position and be willing to resolve conflicts, if appointed.

About the Journal:

The *Journal of Clinical Neurophysiology* features original research articles on the clinical neurophysiology of both central and peripheral nervous systems of humans in health and disease. In addition, many issues contain invited reviews of topics of current interest in clinical neurophysiology. The new editor will have a major role in determining new features of the Journal.
