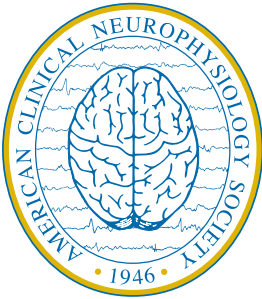

Founded in 1946, the American Clinical Neurophysiology Society (ACNS) is the major professional organization in the United States devoted to the establishment and maintenance of standards of professional excellence in clinical neurophysiology in the practice of neurology, neurosurgery and psychiatry. ACNS members utilize neurophysiology techniques in the diagnosis and management of patients with disorders of the nervous system and in research examining the function of the nervous system in health and disease.

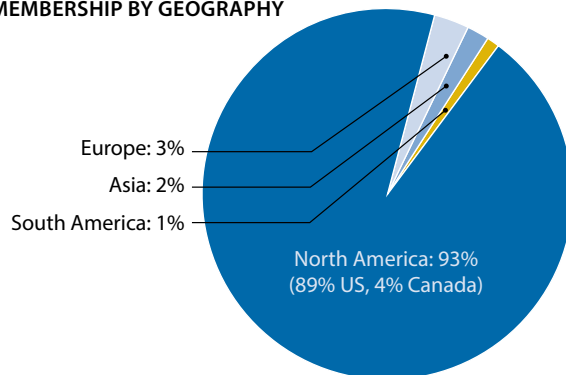
Originally, the Society was most concerned with the establishment of guidelines for practice and the understanding of electroencephalography (EEG). With subsequent development and application of new techniques and further understanding of disease processes, the interests of ACNS membership have broadened. This has been reflected in the education and mission

statement and in the CME program, which now includes all aspects of clinical neurophysiology: electroencephalography, evoked potentials, electromyography, nerve conduction studies, intraoperative monitoring, polysomnography and other sleep technology, quantitative neurophysiological methods, magnetoencephalography, sleep disorders, epilepsy, neuromuscular disorders, brain stimulation, brain-computer interfacing, and related areas.

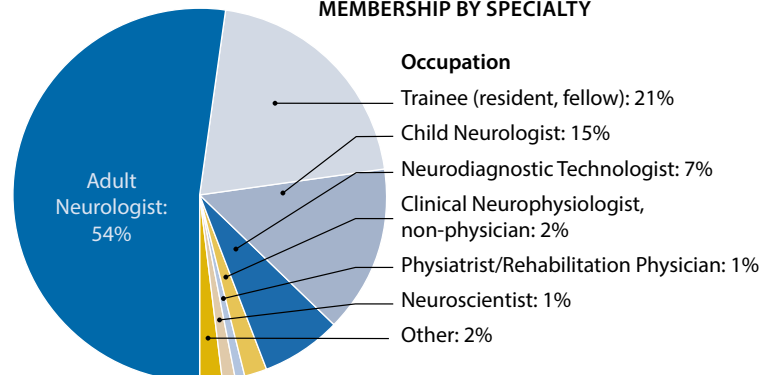
ACNS is a strong advocate for appropriate training in and practice of clinical neurophysiology techniques, and collaborates with other professional societies on strategies to advance the quality of patient care and improve patient outcomes.

Online Education: Overview



CNP Bootcamp

CNP Bootcamp is a seven-week, online program designed to expose new fellows to the core aspects of CNP in the first weeks of their training. CNP Bootcamp can also be a thorough introduction to CNP for residents. CNP Bootcamp encompasses more than 30 total hours of both on-demand instruction and live, interactive content. This includes a comprehensive set of recorded lectures, weekly live discussion sections, additional resources, and recommended reading.

Expected attendance: ACNS expects nearly 30 neurology residency and CNP and epilepsy fellowship programs to participate annually, including more than 200 individual participants.

Special Interest Groups

Open to members only, the newly re-imagined ACNS Special Interest Groups (SIGs) are organized around several main areas of CNP practice providing members the opportunity to connect, network, and participate in interactive education throughout the year.

Each SIG will host two virtual meet-ups annually and will have a dedicated discussion board on *ACNS Connect* to continue the conversation between sessions. The virtual meet-ups offer a variety of activities, including case-based discussions, journal clubs, broad literature resources, and director-led interactive studies.

Principles of Clinical Neurophysiology

Formerly known as the ACNS Fall Courses, the Principles of Clinical Neurophysiology is a live, virtual event designed to deliver basic and intermediate level content. ACNS's educational activities are directed to clinical neurophysiologists, neurologists, neurosurgeons, trainees in these disciplines, technologists and other physicians and researchers who utilize clinical neurophysiologic techniques and knowledge in the diagnosis and management of patients with disorders of the peripheral and central nervous system. Likewise, the courses can serve as a great refresher for those preparing for board exams.

Sessions will be live-streamed, but will not be recorded or available on-demand.

PCNP is a CME activity, planned and implemented in accordance with the Essential Areas and Policies of the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME) through the sponsorship of ACNS. ACNS is accredited by ACCME to provide continuing medical education for physicians.

Unrestricted Educational GrantAny amount

Minimum 15 days lead time required before online educational event.

Virtual Product Theaters\$5,000 each

ACNS is pleased to again offer supporters the opportunity to engage with the ACNS audience with the introduction of virtual product theaters! Similar to the in-person theaters offered during the Annual Meeting, sponsors have the opportunity to program session content designed specifically for the segment of ACNS's membership engaged with a SIG topic. Theaters may be presented at the conclusion of each SIG meet-up, scheduled the first Thursday of every month (see link above for complete schedule).

ACNS will assist sponsoring companies by promoting the Product Theater to members of the SIG using the SIG's *ACNS Connect* community.

Product theater availability is limited to one company per SIG meet-up and will be sold on a first-come, first-served basis determined by date of receipt of program fees. *Minimum lead time of 30 days required before SIG meet-up.*

Other Opportunities

Expert Panel\$10,000

Take advantage of that experience and expertise gathered in one place by convening an Expert Panel! ACNS Expert Panels aim to “serve patients and society by empowering members to advance the science, practice and profession of clinical neurophysiology” through collaboration with industry where member expertise aligns with your organizations stated objectives.

Your organization provides ACNS with goals and objectives for a 90-minute closed-door brainstorming session and may provide background information or resources for distribution prior to the session.

Your organization may select up to seven (7) ACNS members to attend or may provide a set of criteria according to which ACNS can recommend experts. Specific ACNS participants requested by the sponsoring company and are subject to availability and agreement by the physician. ACNS cannot guarantee the participation of specific members and may make substitution suggestions upon request. Up to three (3) representatives from your organization may attend to lead the discussion.

ACNS staff will coordinate logistics, invite participants and communicate details.

Expert panels may be held at the ACNS Annual Meeting, during which ACNS will provide a room to accommodate up to 10 participants, a standard audio-visual set upon request, and either breakfast tor lunch. Other venues may be considered, but additional fees for travel and lodging and other costs may apply. Panels may also be convened virtually.
